


The Good News

Solid waste diversion per person in Canada is increasing, although at a small average rate of 1% per year (2002 - 2022). It is a start; however, more needs to be done to responsibly manage waste. By cutting our reliance on singe-use packaging and products, and scaling up reuse, refill, and repair systems, we can better protect the environment and our health.

While correctly *Recycling* our household products is a great step towards reducing how much waste ends up in landfills, *Reducing* and *Reusing* are the most effective of the three R's. Halton Region Waste Disposal Tool

The Halton Region website <u>has an incredible waste disposal tool</u>, where you can look up how to properly dispose of your household items and divert them from landfill.



While, this tool is useful for finding alternatives to the landfill for many items, Halton Region doesn't accept some common household items for recycling—that's where this guide comes in! Keep reading for donation/recycling/repurposing locations across Burlington for everything from household cleaning supplies to chopsticks!

Metal Clothing Hangers

If they're still functional, try giving them away before recycling—post a note in your building or by your complex's mailboxes or list them on Facebook Marketplace, Kijiji, Freecycle, Nextdoor, Craigslist, or Buy Nothing groups.

If they're in poor condition, you can recycle them at these two Burlington locations:

Batteries

For safety, tape the terminals (+ & - points). If you have a less typical battery type, it doesn't hurt to check with the location in advance of your drop-off to make sure it will be accepted.

Electronics

Did you know that only 17% of e-waste is properly collected and recycled?

Electronics are part of our everyday lives; in fact, you are probably reading this on a digital screen right now! These products take a lot of resources to create (an iPhone takes about 13,000 litres of water to produce! [source]) and, when they are not disposed of properly, they can leak dangerous materials into our air, soil, and water (source).

Furniture

Drop-Off Locations:

- Habitat for Humanity ReStore (get a tax receipt for donations with a value of over \$300)
- Mission Thrift Store
- Rotary Furniture Bank (pick-up offered 1 day per month. Must submit form)
- Salvation Army (no pick-up, coupon for 20% for purchases over \$25 provided)
- Value Village (no pick-up, coupon provided for 20% off up to \$50)
- Freecycle

Personally, almost every piece of furniture I own is second-hand, and I'm grateful to the people who donated the items I now enjoy in my home. Give your items another life—don't let them end up in the garbage!

Household Appliances

This includes dishwashers, refrigerators, A/C units, water heaters, snowblowers/lawnmowers, radiators, and more.

Household Metals

Tire Rims, Pots and Pans, Aluminum Siding, Sports Equipment, Powertools, Trampoline Frames, Metal Fencing, Exercise Bikes, Gym Weights (free of concrete), Metal Sports Nets, Treadmills, and Metal Bike Components.

Note: Halton Region offers a pick-up service for household appliances and metal. No bulk waste or electronics will be accepted for pick-up.

Tires

There are almost 40 locations that accept tires for recycling in Burlington. We have selected a few locations to highlight that are spread throughout the city and a full list is available by searching the RPRA website, <u>here</u>.

Bicycles

Rolling Horse Community Cycle:

This shop will accept any bike for donation, as long as the frame is not bent and it is not covered in rust. They will even take bike repair tools you no longer need. They offer pick-up services, but you must provide one week's notice.

Basic bike repair available on site for a fee.

School/Office Supplies



Staples (2 locations) has a great recycling program for the following items:

- Writing utensils (mechanical & wooden pencils, coloured pencils, pens, markers, crayons)

Did You Know? Many of our household cleaners contain chemicals that are hazardous to us and the environment. Check out <u>this resource</u> from the David Suzuki Foundation, which outlines some facts about hazerdous chemicals, ingredients to look out for, trusted eco-labels, and how to create your own cleaners!

Medicines & Vitamins:

There are over 65 locations in Burlington where you can bring your old and unwanted medications and vitamins for proper disposal. See a full list of local drop-off locations <u>here</u>.

Did You Know? Flushing or tossing medications in the trash can pollute our water, soil, and ecosystems. Pharmaceutical chemicals can leach into our environment if not disposed of correctly, and water treatment plants can't remove all pharmaceutical chemicals.



Art Supplies

Drop-Off Locations:

 Art Gallery of Burlington - The Art Cart is a program where folks can donate their gently used and new art supplies. AGB asks that things are in relative working order and that they're appropriate for a family audience.

Eyeglasses



There are 25 locations in Burlington where you can recycle your old glasses. Check out <u>this resource</u> put together by the <u>Burlington Lions Club</u> to find a location nearest you. Donations received are distributed by <u>Medical Ministries</u> International.

SodaStream CO² Cannisters

Why use Carbonating Cannisters for Sparking Water?

- 1. Plastic bottles are made from fossil fuels and break down into microplastics in our environment. (<u>source</u>)
- 2. Producing ONE single-serve plastic bottle uses about 3x the amount of water that is in the container, *just* to make the container. (<u>source</u>)
- 3. One carbonating cannister can replace thousands of single-serve plastic bottles over its lifetime.

Cannabis Packaging

Drop-Off Locations:

- Value Buds Appleby Crossing (2485 Appleby Line Unit G1)
- Value Buds Maple Mews (1235 Fairview St Unit 2)

Note: Must be 19+ to enter the store and use recycling drop-off.



Did You Know? Most cannabis packaging ends up in landfill due to the size of their containers and the strong adhesive used for the labelling.

Candy/Snack Wrappers

- BurlingtonGreen's Zero-Waste Drop-off Event
- <u>Burlington Centre</u> (Zero Waste Zone) Located beside Bentley & Conspiracy Comics, their Zero Waste Zone features a collection box for candy/snack wrappers (think granola or chocolate bar wrappers, chip bags, fruit snack packets, or anything of a similar material that *crinkles*)

Pro Tip: Collect your smaller wrappers in a larger chip bag and bring it to the Zero Waste bin when full. Personally, I use a Costco-sized bag, which takes me a bit longer to fill!



Chopsticks

Drop-Off Locations:

 <u>Burlington Centre</u> (Zero Waste Zone) - Located beside Bentley & Conspiracy Comics

Disposable Masks

Drop-Off Locations:

- BurlingtonGreen's Zero-Waste Drop-off Event
- <u>Burlington Centre</u> (Zero Waste Zone) Located beside Bentley & Conspiracy Comics, their Zero Waste Zone features a collection box for disposable masks

Plastic Cards:

Drop-Off Locations:

 <u>Burlington Centre Zero Waste Zone</u> - Located beside Bentley & Conspiracy Comics, their Zero Waste Zone features a collection box for plastic cards (think ID cards, empty gift cards, membership cards, etc.)

Musical Equipment:

Drop-Off Locations:

 <u>BurlingtonGreen Zero Waste Drop-offs</u> (anything with an electrical component, such as keyboards, amps, cables, and audio recording equipment is accepted)





Thanks for Reducing, Reusing, & Recycling!

Using packaging and products for a longer time, through reuse, refill, and repair systems, is a great way to reduce waste, save money, and create local jobs.

Canada is on a good path to address the harms caused by plastic, including banning some harmful and unnecessary single-use products. But we must do more!
